Luther A Hart died 2/19/1894, Belmont, aged 73 yrs 4 mos 17 days; Cause, Pneumonia; widowed; born Lavant, Penobscot, ME; Occupation, Painter; son of Elijah and Alice (Abbott) Hart, (birthplaces not given).

Verified in Vital Records of Searsmont, Maine compiled by Isabel Morse Maresh by Picton Press - page 180 the marriage in "Belmont, 1870 Sept 11th by G Richards, Justice of Peace, Thaddeus H Briggs of Belmon & Mrs. Amanda A Moody of Searsmont.

In the book, "Belmont, Maine - The First Hundred Years" by Maresh it shows on page 343 for the 1907 census in Belmont "Moody, Alice A (m Briggs Belfast)" and then *Waverly team Rockland" - this is my great grandfather George Waverly Moody who was a Teamster and did live in Rockland for awhile.

From cousin Valerie on 8/27/06:

Hi, Glad I could help. You don't still have that other lady working on this for you now , do

you? If so, nix her. I will help you find whatever we can find, as it is for my family also, and it won't cost you any money. I did not know that her father took the boys to Mass. Was it after his wife died? I wonder where she went when James and Susanna went to St. Stephen's N. B. for awhile. He was up there on the 1871 census of Charlotte County, OParish of St. Stephen. I will send you a copy of the Census. Dora was 10 on the Census. But, only their kids are listed. Not Amanda. So, she must have gotten married soon after she was living with them. They came back when James' father William died, and he inherited the house. James left his Pump factory business to his oldest son Henry Clay Moody when he left Canada. Henry Clay only ran it for about a year, and then sold it. James had invented this pump, and I am trying to find the patent number on it. I know the design plans were lost in a fire in Lincolnville, but, not sure when . They all had lots of money. Henry Clay went to England after Canada and promoted a Baseball player who was his friend, and then came back and opened up stores in Omaha, Neb. I was just working on getting all that information in a binder today. I have pictures of him, and information on the land he owned in Omaha. He had 6, or 8 lots there he owned. He had different stores. He was a very interesting guy. He was Grammy Dora's oldest brother. I know Dad used to talk about Uncle Henry a lot. I will keep searching this week for more on John. I will try and get to the courthouse in Belfast. Love, Val

In the 1860 census Amanda was living in the home of her husband's brother James. She was 13 yo. Also in the home was a James Fiske, a farmhand.

If John Moody was born in Belmont, you have a problem. There are no vital records for Belmont. I believe that they were burned in one of those infamous fires that have plagued genealogists for ages. My Great-Grandfather was born in Belmont in 1842 and the only way I discovered it was because his birth date was also recorded in my home town, Freedom. I do have a ace in the hole, but I need to hunt for it. Isabel Morse Maresh reconstructed the Belmont records as best as anyone could and she gave me her draft copy that was sent off to the printer. I'll let you know if I find anything in that.

Maine Historical Society genealogist found a record of John R Moody and Amanda A Hart, both of Lincolnville, ME as filing intent of marriage on 4/1/1862 and cert 4/5/1862. This record was in the "Vital Records of Lincolnville, ME Prior to 1892" by Picton Press in Rockport, ME c1993.

Also in my book, "Vital Records of Searsmont, Maine compiled by Isabel Morse Maresh by Picton Press it shows from the 'The Republican Journal' - 18 Apr 1862 In Searsmont, 4/5/ by SM Dunton, Esq, Mr John R Moody and Miss Amanda A Hart both of Lincolnville." marriage record.

In the 1870 census John is no longer living with his parents and he and Amanda and George (child) cannot be found in census records.

In book on Belmont it has Amanda A in a Belmont census for 1907 and as Alice A Moody (m Briggs) and it also lists my great

grandfather as Waverly and as a Teamster in Rockland - his middle name and one of his professions and he did live in Rockland for awhile and he and Nellie had a couple of kids.

My email to family on 7/16/06:

The genealogists I have been working with now strongly feel that we are descended (legally) from William of Newbury who of course is descended from Sir Edmund of England... and they believe (along with me) that the line I have been pursuing - which was going back to 4 great grandparents William Moody of Maine and his wife Patience Thorndike, then 3 great grandparents William Robert Moody and his wife Abigail Mahoney who had the son John R Moody, born abt 1839 in Belmont or Searsmont, ME. Based on our g grandfather George Waverly Moody's death certificate he and Amanda Hart were George's legal parents. I have recently met a Valerie Moody Giusto (husband from Napa, CA) of Maine who is also descended from William and Patience... therefore we are pretty close cousins. She is documented. We are not because of the 1855 fire in Belmont, ME.

Anyway - William and Patience and this whole Moody line were wealthy, good people and very well known.

It all just fits that we belong in this family (according to what little I can dig up about John, Amanda, George, etc.) and I'm 90% convinced of it. But, of course the DNA results are now coming in from the William of Newbury descendant Moody males - they are matching each other and Bud we are not. We are not matching anyone.

The genealogists (as they so delicately put it) believe that in our line somewhere there was "an alternative paternity event". We are not biologically Moody's - such a shock to know that - for me anyway - since I have been so immersed in this for two years.

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The day may come that some man, some where will do the same DNA Project as us and we will be notified of a match - but to a different surname project than the Moody one.

It makes me wonder if possibly Amanda Hart (and I know a lot of this is repeat) who was 15 and pregnant when John R married her could have been pregnant by another man and possibly that is why they split up and he went out west and she later married Thaddeus Briggs. Maybe John found out the truth and just divorced her and left Maine for new places. I don't know - this is pure speculation on my part and the other genealogists I have been working with.

On review of all old documents I see again that on George's dc his father is listed as John Moody who was born in Belmont, ME and was a farmer by occupation - this does leave out the John R Moody who went to CA and actually became a merchant in Oakland.

Notes for THADDEUS H BRIGGS:

In the 1870 Belmont census he is shown as living with his mother Sarah who was born abt 1800 in Maine. He is a farmer. In the 1880 census he is shown as being born abt 1841 and living in Belmont with his wife Amanda A Briggs, born abt 1848 - both born in ME. In the 1860 census he is living Belmont with his father Bartlett Briggs who is 59 and a farmer. Thaddeus is 20 and also a farmer.

In the 1907 census for Belmont, ME in "Belmont, Maine - The First Hundred Years" by Maresh on page 340 the following is shown, "Briggs, T far Belfast Alice A (Hart-Moody)"

Notes for GEORGE WAVERLY MOODY:
Marilyn's great grandfather

He was a farm laborer, and later worked as a quarryman. In the 1910 census he lived with Nellie on the Old County Road in Rockland, Knox, ME. The quarries in Thomaston are still visible today. In previous censuses he was living in Thomaston and in the 1880 census when he was 17 yo he was reported to be a boarder with the George S Hall family.

Per a volunteer in Maine who does genealogy look ups - he was also a Teamster.

Another look up by a volunteer in Maine shows that Nellie was born in Bremen and George was born in Lincolnville. The latter place of birth (George's) she was not completely sure of... 11/22/05 per the Lincolnville town clerk there is no record there of his birth. The other possibility for place of birth is Searsmont.

From the Annals of Warren: "... in petitioning for the incorporation of another town, which was granted the 20th of March following and a gore of about 6,000 acres of land between Oyster and Mill Rivers, taken from Warren and annexed to the new town. This was named THOMASTON, in honor of Major General John Thomas of the Massachusetts line, who died the preceding year at Chamblec." and, "Thomas, then containing South Thomaston and Rockland, gradually increased in wealthy

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and population till the census of 1790, when its inhabitants amounted to 801. Its growth was much more rapid, after Gen Knox made it the place of his residence in 1794."

He was a Laborer for the City at the time of his death and the cause was Pyelonephritis which he'd had for two years. A contributing cause of death (that he had for 10 years) was arterio sclerosis. He is buried in Thomaston, ME.

Notes for NELLIE E HUMPHREY:

In the 1930 census Nellie is shown as living with her daughter Constance and her family. Nellie is listed as being 64 yo which would make her year of birth 1866. They were living in Rockland, Knox, Maine. This census also shows that she is still married, but George is not listed as living there.

In the 1900 census Nellie E Moody is 34, born est 1866 and living in Thomaston, Knox, Maine with her husband George "W" Moody and their children.

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Notes for ANDROUS MITCHELL MOODY:

In some data bases he is under the name Androus M Moody, Andrus, Andras and others as Andrew. Since Androus is used most often that is what he will be under in this family tree. Also, he has two est birth years - 1893 and 1887. It appears that the 1887 date is most correct.

In the 1900 census Andrew M Moody is shown as 13 yo with est year of birth as 1887 in Maine. He is living in Thomaston/Knox, Maine with his family:

Fa: George W Moody, 37 yo born Dec 1872.
Mo: Nellie E Moody 34 yo, born Aug 1865
Sisters: Constance A, 11 yo born Mar 1889 and Edith M 6 yo born Oct 1893.

In the 1920 census Androus was living in Rockland/Knox, ME with his wife Ada (22 yo) and sons George (5 yo) and Henry A (4 yo). It states he was a laborer at a gas plant. It shows his dob as abt 1894.

In the 1930 census he is shown as Andras Moody living with his wife Ada in Boston/Suffolk, Ma, as 43 yo born abt 1887. Also, there appears to be a census error this year in listing a 2 yo Patricia ODonnell as being Andras and Ada's daughter, while also showing her parents as both being born in MA.

The social security death index does show his name as Androus. SSN 005-14-3870 and last residence as being Portland, Cumberland, ME.

At the time of this marriage Rena was living in Camden, ME and Androus in Thomaston, ME. It appears that they divorced before 1910.

Notes for ADA FRANCES MORAN:

Ada F Moran is shown in the 1900 census as 6 yo, born in December 1893 and living in Thomaston/Knox, Maine with her father Henry P Moran, mother, Maude M, 1/2 sister Jessie M Armatney - looks like Armstrong in the

handwritten census (12 yo and born in Maine), 1/2 brother William L Armateny - looks like Armstrong (10 yo and born in Maine) and sister, Jennie E Moran (3 yo and born in Maine).

Ada is shown as 36 yo and as the head of household in the 1930 census and as living in Rockland, Knox, Maine

with two of her sons, Henry (15 yo) and Donald (6 yo).

There were also two boarders: Charles Stevens 70 yo, born in Maine and both of his parents born in ME. He had no occupation. The other was Stillman Stevens, 41, born in Maine and both parents also born in Maine. He was a chauffeur for a coal company.

She is also in the 1930 census as living with Andres in Everett/Middlesex, Massachusetts, but she is also listed as living near her mother and father in Rockland, Knox, ME with her sons Henry and Donald.

In the Maine marriages database their marriage is listed for Androus M Moody of Rockland, ME and Ida F. Moran of Rockland, ME.

Notes for RUTH E GARDNER:

Note: Ruth went by Gardiner and Wooster for surnames. It appears that she was married to George L Wooster on 10/14/1933. And, she may have gone by the name Ruth Jacobson also.
