

Obituary of Adeline (Perley) Hartt
April 10,1821 - July 10,1873

At Hartt's Mills, North Branch, Oromocto, Sunbury County, on the 16th ult., after a few months sickness, which she bore with Christian patience. **Adeline Hartt**, the beloved wife of Thomas Endicott Hartt , esq. age 53 years.

She leaves a kind husband, three sons and one daughter and an aged mother, with many relatives and a large circle of friends to mourn their loss. Sister Hartt professed religion and was baptized about (15) years ago by the late Rev. Samuel Hartt, and united with the Free Baptist Church in this place. Her hope was firm to the end. May the grace of God sustain and comfort Bro. Hartt and the motherless children and the aged mother under their heavy affliction.

The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Messrs, McKenzie and Brown and Bro. Cahill (Baptist). Sermon by the author. Text. Phil 1:21

At South Branch Oromocto, on the 12th inst. April, of Measles, **Edward Alvin Smith**, aged 4 months, youngest son of Thatcher and Phoebe Smith.

Hartt: At Fredericton Junction, October 24th, of larynxes diphtheria, **Bertie**, aged 3 years, only son of David T. & Ada L. Hartt “**Of such is the kingdom of God**”

Marriage: 1871

At Blissville, Sunbury, County on the 9th inst., by the Rev. David Oram, **Mr. Henry Hartt**, son of the late Rev. Samuel Hartt to **Miss Phoebe Ann Smith**, daughter of the late Deacon Daniel Smith.

Marriage August 1883

On the 35th July, at the residence of the brides father, by the Rev. J.G. MacKenzie, r. **David T. Hartt**, of Gladstone, Sunbury County, and Miss **Ada L. MacKenzie**, of Hampstead, Queens County. NB

Married on the 17th inst., at the residence of the bride's father. by Rev. Garrity Mr. **Charles G. Hartt** of Fredericton to **Miss Lavinia Duplisea** of Tracy, Oromocto, Sunbury County.

Marriage 1885

At the residence of the bride's step mother, George Street. Fredericton, on the 17 inst, by Rev. A.J. Mowatt, **John Taylor Esq.** of Manners-Sutton, York County, to Miss **Phoebe A. Hartt**, second daughter of the late David Hartt, Esq of Gladstone, Sunbury County.

Marriage 1881

On the 5th inst., by the Rev. J. Gunter, **D. W. Hartt**, Esq. of Gladstone, Sunbury County, and **Miss Lottie A. Adams**, of Lincoln, Sunbury County

Death 1895

Pride: At Fredericton Junction on the July 10, 1895, **Miss Mary Pride**, aged 82 years. She was a Christian, and her death was peaceful and happy; she was anxious to go and quietly fell asleep in Jesus.

Obituary of Phebe (Phillips) Hartt
1787-1867
Wife of Pioneer Thomas Hartt

At her residence, Blissville, on December 24, 1867, after a brief illness of 4 days, **Mrs. Phebe Hartt**, age 80 years, wife of the late Pioneer Thomas Hartt of the place, leaving 3 sons, 7 daughters, and a large number of grandchildren to mourn their loss.

Notwithstanding Mrs. Hartt's advanced age and consequent infirmities in her death her children and others have sustained a sad bereavement. Retaining her faculties to the last she was able to afford them the benefit of her earnest and constant prayers. She was a Christian from her youth, faithful and devoted at all times, and her triumphant death was a fitting end of a useful and godly life.
