The Headquarters, Fredericton, N.B

December 5, 1860

On Monday last, Mr. David Pugh, who resides at the Nashwaaksis Stream near its junction with the Saint John River, opposite Fredericton, left home in company with his wife in order to come to town. On reaching the ice, Mr. Pugh passed over the worst part of it, and then returned for Mrs. Pugh but their united weight was too much for the imperfect ice to bear, and they broke through together; but succeeding for a short time to keep their heads over water their cries were heard by the neighbors who hastened to their rescue. Mr. Pugh's brother, Stephen, was the first to reach them, but he also broke through. In the meantime, the greatest efforts were made by the drowning parties to save each others lives, but even with the aid of those who came to their rescue, Mr. Pugh was taken out in a state of insensibility, while, we, deeply regret to add, the utmost efforts afterwards made to resuscitate Mrs. Pugh proved unavailing. The deceased was, we understand, in the 22nd year of her age, and leaves two young children, to whom she alluded in her dying moments as well as a very large circle of friends to lament their loss.

After Julia died, David had Sarah Hartt Cook help with the family. Sarah Cook was the widow of James Cook and sister of Julia. George L. Pugh used to affectionately refer to her as "Auntie Cook". Julia is buried in the

Loyalist Burial Ground, Fredericton with her father, George C. Hartt and her mother Jane.

"Death came suddenly last night to George L. Pugh, of Nashwaaksis, as he was returning

from Cape Breton with his daughter, Mrs. George McKnight and her family who had been spending the holidays with Mr. McKnight.

The details concerning Mr. Pugh's death are meager and it is not know whether he died in the automobile or at the farm house forty miles the other side of Amherst, N.S. where he was taken by Mrs. McKnight and from where she telephoned her brothers here.

The late Mr. Pugh was one of the best known men in Nashwaaksis, he was at he the time of his death, one of the valutors for the municipality of York and at different times held various positions of trust with the county. He was respected by all who knew him and his sudden passing will be learned of with regret.

Serepta Ann Carle was known as Seppie. She worked in the cotton mill in Marysville, NB where she boarded with Horace Pugh. She is buried in the Douglas Rural Cemetery in York County (also known as the Pickard Cemetery).

Former Alderman Died at His Home

George McKnight was Employed as District Engineer on Renous-Plaster Rock Road.

The death occurred this morning at his home in University Avenue of George A.

McKnight, after a long period of ill-health and a month's serious illness.

Mr. McKnight was a son of the late William and Agnes (Knox) McKnight and had been a resident of Fredericton the greater part of his life. He early in life became interested in engineering and was employed as an engineer on the construction of the Transcontinental Railway and the Valley Railway. He also was an engineer with the Nashwaaksis Pulp and Paper Company and highway engineer on the Renous-plaster Rock Highway now under construction. He was city engineer of Fredericton for some time, active in many undertakings, deeply interested in the affairs of the City and Christ Church Cathedral. He represented Kings Ward at the City Council for some years and was known for his sound judgment and clear-sightedness. In his home he was a devoted husband and father, in the community in which he lived he was known for his love of the children and was never too busy to assist in any of their undertakings in which his aid was asked. In early life he was active in the militia being an officer. He was a member of Salisbury Lodge F. and A. M. He will be greatly missed and his death regretted. He is survived by his widow, two sons. W. Stewart McKnight, who was one of those chosen to go to London at the time of the Coronation of King George and Queen Elizabeth and George T. McKnight, and two daughters, Betty and Jean McKnight, all at home, and a sister, Mrs. David L. Targett,

Fredericton.

The funeral will take place on Thursday afternoon with service at his home, 414 University Avenue at 2:30 o'clock by Rev. Harry Ploughman of Christ Church Cathedral and interment in Forest Hill Cemetery. George McKnight bought a monument for the cemetery plot on January 7th, 1910.
