Natane Sinclair Nason (1916-2005)

(Natane, Marshall, Hattie, Mehetable, Thomas, Thomas A. Jonathan, Samuel, Isaac)

Natane “Tane” Sinclair Nason was born on June 12, 1916 in Stonewall, Manitoba. Her name is a Metis name – half French and half native. Although there should be an accent mark over the E, it is not included here.

Tane was married twice and divorced twice. She married her first husband, George Hughes, in Reno, Nevada. They had no children.

Tane married again; this time to George F. Nutting. The marriage took place in Richmond, California. George was a jeweler and made many fine pieces of jewelry for her. He passed away in the late 1990s. George and Tane were divorced long before he died.

Marshall Rutherford Nason (1917-2004)

Marshall R. Nason was born September 23, 1917 in Manitoba, Canada. He was a citizen of the US and served in the Army Signal Corps. Marshall was married three times. His first marriage was to Molly Comstock, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Marshall and Molly had one son, Marshall Nason. In 2004, the son was living in Atlanta, Georgia, with his wife, Kathleen. They had three children: Shelley, Bartram, and Sienna.

Second, Marshall R. Nason married Thelma Campbell. She died in 1989. The couple had no children.

Marshall R. Nason’s third marriage was to Marilee Schmit. The couple remained together until he passed away. Marilee was much beloved by Tane and the rest of the family. After Marshall passed away, Marilee called Tane every Sunday night. Marshall and Marilee had no children.
