She experience ----- grace in her youth, and from that time to the close a happy and useful life; she lived in peace with God and the world, and died as she lived; she was a warm-hearted, a affectionate, and confiding wife, an indulgent parent, kind neighbor and faithful friend. She loved the house of God and the children of God, and she loved the cause of the Redeemer, and when restrained by disease, she found him present to administer consolation on her death bed. Her sickness was of a short duration, only about a week, and as she approached the hour of dissolution, she calmly resigned herself and all the affairs of this life to God, and gave directions concerning her funeral-selecting the text, (Rev. 14 Chapter and 13th verse) and also hymns to be sung. She requested all her relatives and friends to come near that she might tell them of her joys and invite them to meet her in Glory. Thus the good is taken from the evil to come. Her death took place on the 13th of April, and her funeral was attended on the 15th, by a large concourse of relations, who deeply sympathized with a surviving husband and 4 small children together with a kind father and mother, brothers and sisters. Who mourn their loss. Such sudden removals from our mortal shores of the beloved ones to Zion are to be regarded (as) so many warnings to prepare to meet God and to meet them in heaven.

Secord Entered into rest, at Fredericton Junction, September 1, 1893 **J. Herbert Secord** B.A., in the 24th year of his age. Decreased was the only son of the late John Secord and Dr. Lizzie Secord. He was a young man of sterling qualities; to know him was to love him; his genial nature and kindly manner made him a favorite with all. He graduated in the class of '91 from Acadia College, and subsequently filled the position of teacher in the High School at Vancouver, BC. On account of failing health he spent last winter in the south, hoping the change might improve and restore his health, but disease had fastened it self upon him, and the past few months he realized the end was near, and could say "it is well". The writer of this notice had the pleasure of his acquaintance during his stay in Texas, and also accompanied him to his home in May last, and by request of deceased, conducted the funeral services which were held in the F. C. Baptist Church in Fredericton Junction. The large concourse of people which came to pay the last tribute of respect to one they knew and loved, told the esteem in which he was held by all.
